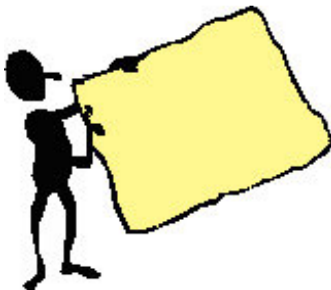

**CALL FOR POSTERS**

The Institute of Archaeologists of Ireland (IAI) are currently organising a one-day Summer Conference which will be held in the Red Cow Hotel in Dublin on July 18<sup>th</sup> 2009. The conference aims to examine the ongoing Government-led review of policy and practice in Irish archaeology and will also explore the prospects for the profession in the current economic climate. A series of speakers from third-level institutions, private companies and government departments will participate in the conference, which promises to be informative and rewarding.



The Institute is currently organising a poster-display area where members of the Institute, conference sponsors and post-graduate students of archaeology may display posters which illustrate the nature of their research or highlight interesting aspects of their fieldwork, but **which need not necessarily address the conference theme**. Posters should be A1 or A0 in size, should be printed on a single sheet of good quality paper and should, ideally, be composed of a combination of text (600-1,000 words) and high quality colour or greyscale images.



Members of the IAI Conference Sub-Committee will hang the posters on the display boards on the evening of Friday 17<sup>th</sup> and on the morning of Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> July and the posters will then be on public display for the remainder of the conference. A prize will be awarded to the best poster displayed by a post-graduate student.
