

***Journal of Irish Archaeology* Author Self-Archiving Policy**

In recent years it has become increasingly common for authors of journal articles to deposit digital copies of their work in institutional repositories or on sites such as academia.edu (<http://www.academia.edu>), Mendeley (<http://www.mendeley.com/>) and ResearchGate (<http://www.researchgate.net/>). At the *Journal of Irish Archaeology* (JIA) we recognise the benefits that this can bring to both author and journal in terms of increased recognition for and access to the high quality research that is published in our journal. We are also mindful that openness and access to research outputs are now common conditions of funding provided by research councils and similar organisations. The editorial board of the JIA has therefore formulated this author self-archiving policy to help authors meet these conditions and to allow them to distribute the results of their research within the limits defined below.

Pre-prints of *Journal of Irish Archaeology* articles

Authors who contribute to the JIA retain the copyright of article content published within the journal. The author version of the article, before the publisher has added value such as layout and formatting, is defined here as a pre-print. At the JIA we are happy to allow authors to distribute pre-prints that include amendments and changes to their articles that were made after peer-review.

When the pre-print of an accepted paper is uploaded to a repository the authors should include a note citing the published version, emphasising that this is the definitive version of the article. The note should include a full citation for the published article, as well as some explanatory text along the following lines:

This is an author produced pre-print of a peer-reviewed article that has been accepted for publication in the Journal of Irish Archaeology. The definitive publisher version is available at [INSERT FULL CITATION HERE]. Please cite the published version of this paper where possible.

Post-prints of *Journal of Irish Archaeology* articles

Each author published in the JIA receives a PDF file of the published version of their work once the hard copy of the journal has been distributed. We define this as a post-print. These are provided for limited distribution amongst colleagues. This post-print can now also be uploaded to a repository, or a similar site, as long as **public availability is delayed until a period of 24 months after publication.**

The post-print should include full citation details, with a note that contains text along the following lines:

This is an authenticated version of an article that has been published in the Journal of Irish Archaeology. [INSERT FULL CITATION HERE].

NB: Authors should note that they should not distribute copies of JIA articles that have been downloaded from JSTOR, this is not allowed within the terms and conditions of JSTOR use.
