This one day training workshop shall address how to identify and describe the key attributes of post-medieval ceramics that enable correct identification of post-medieval pottery in the field and in post-excavation analysis

The second half of the workshop will build on from the pottery training to include other post-medieval fabrics and structures they came from.

Both sessions will consist of formal presentations, followed by a practical session.

to archaeologists working on excavation projects who feel the need to upskill their knowledge of the identification of post-medieval pottery and related materials. to archaeologist involved at the post-excavation stage of archaeological projects in terms

of cataloguing post-medieval pottery typically found in Ireland.
